### CEUs

ISA is now using a digital CEU form instead of a paper sheet. Here's the link to our digital CEU form:

- To earn CEUs you'll need both: the **CEU code #** AND the **title of the session** (the CEU code will be read aloud at the end of every session)
- We highly recommend saving your own record of CEUs (write the titles and codes on a piece of paper, or make a note in your phone and take a screenshot, etc.) – if you need help, just come to the registration desk

How to fill out the online CEU form:

- Enter your Name, Email and Certification # (e.g. ON-1234A)
- Select the session title from the dropdown menu
- Enter the CEU code (the code will be read aloud at the end of every session)
- You can enter a few sessions, save the form and come back later, (or you can enter all at once)
  - If you click Save – you'll be able to email a copy of the form to yourself – you'll receive an email with a link to continue the form. Use the email link you receive to go back and continue entering CEU codes
  - When you've finished entering all the CEU codes, click "Save and Submit"
    - You will be asked to create a signature (you will "draw" your signature on screen)
    - You will be emailed a copy of your submission
